

Hiram, as King of Tyre, reigned over a Phoenician city noted for its wealth, its skilled artificers, its daring seamen and as the source of the deep purple dye that became a badge of rank throughout the known world. Tyrian dye gave rise to the phrase, "born to the purple," to describe one of royal blood.

Tyrian sailors, long before Roman excursions to Britain, made their way to that "far off island" for tin. Their city, today in Lebanon — then in Phoenicia — is buried by the rubble and ruins of civilizations that followed.

Excavating now in progress will continue for years to come to uncover the successive layers of remnants of the past left by the Assyrians, the Babylonians, Persians, Macedonians, Romans, the Byzantines, Arabs, Crusaders and others.

The tomb near ancient Tyre is reportedly that of Hiram of Tyre, "Pillar of Strength."

"Truth or Consequences"

Historians of old say that both Hiram of Tyre and Solomon were fond of proposing enigmas to each other for solution. Supposedly Solomon first sent some to Hiram, who, being unable to solve them, paid a large amount of money in forfeit. He in turn propounded a number to Solomon. When the latter was unable to answer them, he paid Hiram a larger forfeit than he had earlier received from the Tyrian King. History does not name the ultimate winner in the exchange of riddles.
