

Masonic Mutual Gives Annual Meeting Report

The annual meeting of the Masonic Mutual Benefit Association was held in the Masonic Temple, as called for, on Monday, January 8th, 1973. The regular routine of business consisted of reports by the Secretary, Harmon E. Boice, and Treasurer Masao Kon.

A matter of great concern to the trustees was voiced in an earnest discussion on ways and means of maintaining memberships, and in the difficulty of increasing memberships in such a worthy Masonic Benevolent Society as we maintain through a mutual understanding of the type of service we render. Granted that the \$300 we have to offer is plenty small as prices go these days, but in our many years of operation we have experienced many cases where that \$300 instant cash was found as almost "Manna from Heaven," when in distress all assets have been temporarily frozen.

In nearly eighty years of continuous service we have dispensed the sum of \$179,437 to the designated beneficiaries of departed Brother Masons. We have lost twenty-five members during this previous year, ten by death, and fifteen by default.

We solicit all Master Masons to join with us in support of this very important Masonic benevolence. You will be glad you did.


At this time, we know nothing more than has been published in the News. There are many things to be discussed with the possible purchasers. As we arrive at the end result, we will keep everyone informed.



Sloppy Addresses

Sloppy Addresses are a big mess-The Postal Service gets four to five billion pieces of undeliverable mail each year. "Sloppy" addresses are a "massive problem" for the postal services, said Anthony J. Trenga, manager of the Customer Programs Divisions.

The huge volume of incorrectly addressed mail stems mainly from the fact that some 40 million families move each year.

Sometimes no effort is made to change addresses. Other times the change of address is incorrectly transmitted by the relocated family or incorrectly recorded by the mailer.

The Postal Service provides a mailing list correction service for 10 cents per name, which the Toledo Masonic Bulletin utilizes. This information is then sent to the secretary concerned.
