Name Max Clark 117th Grand Commander K. T. of Michigan

Max Leon Clark, Jackson businessman who gained national fame as an expert in metal welding techniques, was unanimously elevated to the office of Right Eminent Grand Commander of Michigan's 11,500 Knights Templar during the closing sessions of the 117th Annual Conclave held at Flint June 2, 1973. He is the sixth Jackson Chivalric Mason to hold the office, his predecessors having been Benjamin Porter in 1864; John L. Mitchell, 1870; Hollis F. Knapp, 1878; Albert Stiles, 1897; and Charles H. Patterson in 1918.

In his special chosen field of endeavor he has served as charter chairman of the Central Michigan Chapter of the American Welding Society and was named Director of National Welding Supply Dealers Association. He also served as President of the Midwest Airco Dealers Association and from 1952 to 1971 was President of Jackson Welding Supply Co. He sold his business and now serves as

A Hoosier by birth, Sir Knight Clark first saw the light of day March 21, 1918, at Huntington, Indiana.

Almost exactly twenty and a half years to the day we find that young Max Clark had already made up his mind about the girl of his choice. Indeed, she was the sparkling Lusina M. Taylor of Fort Wayne, Indiana, and wedding bells rang out October 12, 1938. To this union have been born four sons and one daughter;

In the process of establishing a home to his liking, the Grand Commander and his lady decided that Jackson, Michigan, would be the ideal spot and since we have already outlined his business pursuits, we can only add that work and community activities have been legion and his place in Jackson is very substantial.

The cause of good schooling has long been one of his aims, and thus we find that he served as a member of the Board of Education. The family are regular members of the United Methodist Church of Jackson and he has given service as a member of the church's finance committee. He is also a member of the Kiwanis Club, the Town Club of Jackson, and is Vice-President of Arbor Hills Country Club of Jackson.

His Masonic history begins in Fort Wayne, Indiana, in the year 1944, when he was raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason on April 24 in Home Lodge No. 342. Seeking further light, he was exalted in Thomas R. Marshall Chapter

No. 3, R.A.M., now Fort Wayne Chapter No. 19, May 8, 1945, and greeted in Clinton Council No. 47, R. & S. M. of Tiffin, Ohio, December 11, 1946.

After moving to Jackson, Michigan, he was knighted in Jackson Commandery No. 9, K.T., December 28, 1953, and in 1961 served as Eminent Commander.

In order to enjoy a more active Masonic life, he transferred his lodge membership from Fort Wayne to Jackson in 1966, becoming a member of Jackson Lodge No. 17. He became a member of Moslem Shrine in 1954; Jackson York Rite College in 1958; the Scottish Rite Bodies of the Valley of Detroit in 1970, and the Royal Order of Jesters, also in 1970. He is also a member of New Temple Chapter No. 3, O.E.S., having transferred his membership in 1967 from St. Mary's Chapter No. 203 of Poe, Indiana.

From the above it can be seen that Michigan's new Grand Commander leads a busy life indeed, but he still finds time for relaxation, when he likes to work on his farm or take time out for golfing. Hunting, fishing, and almost any sports event also claim his interest but take second place to the welfare of Templary.
