

Retired Soft Drink Mfr. Named Grand Master

A partially retired soft dring manufacturer, Wilfred E. Adams, who gains relaxation by making unusual ceramic creations and Christmas tree farming, was named Grand Master of Masons in Michigan by acclamation, Wednesday, May 23, 1973. He is the 123rd Past Master to serve as Michigan's No. 1 Mason and the third from Saginaw.

Wilfred E. Adams first saw the light of day in Midland County, June 6, 1912; he was the only son of a family of two born to John Q. and Effie M. Adams.

During his high school days, Wilfred the young man began to show great potentialities in sales and merchandising, and his abilities in these fields undoubtedly awakened in him the latent qualities of the business executive which he eventually became.

First he obtained a part time shoe sales job for the G. R. Kinney Company while still in high school, and upon graduation he continued on a full time basis and in 1931 became Assistant Manager of the Saginaw store. In 1932 he moved to Midland and engaged in the poultry business for the next seven years.

During conversations with his father he made a decision which was to establish the format of his future business career, and in 1939 we find him joining his Dad in the manufacture of soft drinks. His father was already part owner of Chapman's Beverages, a soft drink concern, one of the oldest in the state, established at Caro in 1917. He first became a Sales Supervisor and later acquired an interest in the firm, became a partner, and, later, co-owner of the company.

After some thirty years in the soft drink business he decided upon a role of retirement June 1, 1971,

Civic and industrial organizations have long received his active support and participation, and while living in Midland County he served two terms as Moderator of the local school board, and between the years 1958 and 1968 he served as a Director of the Michigan Soft Drink Association.

Masonic Mutual Benefit Association Special Meeting Report

This special meeting was attended by a fine group of dedicated Master Masons, dedicated to the perpetuation of the Ann Arbor Blue Lodge Mutual Benefit Association now proudly in its eightieth year of operation.

A report on the state of the Association was presented in which it was revealed that during these past eighty years benefits amounting to \$181,862.00 had been presented to the families of 625 Brother Masons who had passed to that Celestial Lodge above.

It was also revealed that the Association had met with unfortunate experiences during the year 1972 and to date in 1973 in that it had been presented with 24 death claims. These claims were all paid on time but with some strain upon our financial resources, and with 7 claims remaining to be assessed for.

This situation was cleared up by unanimous decision whereby the 7 remaining claims be included in one assessment package to avoid duplication of printing and postage costs for an estimated saving of about \$140.00. And, it was decided by unanimous action that future savings be made by eliminating returning notice of payments made by checks. And, it was also decided by unanimous action that future assessments be made on each 3 deaths as claims accumulate.

Serious consideration was given to ways and means to stabilize our membership, and, as this Association is sponsored by the 3 Ann Arbor Blue Lodges, hope was expressed that more Masonic Brothers would acquaint themselves with the value to the Fraternity of maintaining this 80 year Masonic Heritage by joining with us in a more cooperative effort.
