

Charles Ridoutt Michigan's Grand High Priest



Charles W. Ridoutt, a native of Muskegon Heights and resident of Grand Haven, became by acclamation the 115th Michigan Royal Arch Mason to be named Most Excellent Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Michigan and the first resident of Grand Haven to occupy the top Royal Arch office. He was named to the office Saturday, October 20, during the final session of the 125th Annual Convocation held in the City of Flint.

Born at Muskegon Heights, August 25, 1912, he is the eldest of four children of English emigrants who made their home in Western Michigan at the turn of the century. Wedding bells beckoned Charles W. Ridoutt after he had carefully selected the charming Miss Vera and in 1934 the happy couple marched down the aisle. To the union have been born three daughters and one son, and they can now boast of seven grandchildren.

Since he was raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason in Spring Lake Lodge No. 234 in 1945, this Companion's spare time has nearly all been devoted to

Masonry and the York Rite Bodies. He served Spring Lake Lodge as Worshipful Master in 1950 and 1970 and was its Secretary from 1965 to 1969. Exalted in Corinthian Chapter No. 84, R.A.M., he became its Excellent High Priest in 1949 and received the Order of High Priesthood. He was greeted in Muskegon Council No. 54, R. & S. M., in 1949, serving as Thrice Illustrious Master in 1955 and Recorder from 1959 to 1966; and was Knighted in Muskegon Commandery No. 22, K.T., and served as Eminent Commander in 1956.

Having served as presiding officer of all four bodies, he became a Knight of the York Cross of Honor in Fred H. Pocock Priory during the year 1956. He became a member of York Rite College No. 10 in 1957 and helped to revamp this body when it was resuscitated in June, 1973, and is now the College's Treasurer.

Active with Commandery affairs, he helped to reorganize the defunct West Michigan Battalion and held the offices of president and Captain General. He was on the Instruction Board of Grand Commandery from 1962 to 1973 and in 1966 received the Grand Commander's Service Award, Grand Council called upon him to serve as a District Deputy Instructor from 1959 to 1973 and named him to its Ritual Committee in 1965-66. He was chairman of the committee which revised the Story of Masonry, presenting in chronological order the degrees of the Chapter and Council. He is also a member of the Scottish Rite bodies of the Valley of Grand Rapids and is a Past Worthy Patron of Spring Lake Chapter No. 411, O.E.S. He holds honorary memberships in a large number of bodies in the western part of the state.

THE MASTER'S LETTER

Dear Brethren:

Although it doesn't seem possible (to me anyway) this is the eleventh of the twelve monthly reports that I will be making to you.
