Hiram, King of Tyre

Hiram, King of Tyre, was what we would probably call the "prime contractor" for Solomon's Temple. He supplied the skilled artisans and materials used in the building. The Israelites were an agricultural people whereas the men of Tyre were skilled artisans in woodwork, stone masonry and the molding and casting of metals.

A contemporary and friend of both David and Solomon, Hiram supplied the "cedar trees, and carpenters, and masons" to build David a house (II Samuel 5:11.) Forty years later, Solomon requested assistance from Hiram to build the Temple.

Hiram supplied the cedars as well as the workmen for the building in the Temple. In return, Solomon sent Hiram wheat and oil from Israel. When the Temple was completed, Solomon gave Hiram 20 towns in Galilee. Hiram was quite disappointed in these towns. This incident appears in the Sixth Degree of the Scottish Rite.

According to Masonic tradition, Hiram was the Grand Master of all Freemasons. When he visited Solomon prior to the consecration of the Temple, he found Solomon had been inspired by God "above all mortal men" and yielded his pre-eminence to Solomon. He is supposed to have acted as Senior Warden when the mythical Master's Lodge was held in the Temple.

Hiram is also referred to as the "pillar of strength" as "by his power and wealth he assisted the great undertaking" (of constructing the Temple.)

Tradition states Hiram visited Solomon many times to consult on the symbolism of the Word. He gave his daughter in marriage to Solomon. Tyrian mariners taught Jewish sailors how to bring gold from India to beautify the Temple.

Hiram was king of the City-State of Tyre in Phoenecia, now known as Lebanon, for 34 years. Located about 15 miles from the present Israeli border, Tyre was an important maritime seaport for several centuries. Tyrian sailors went as far as Great Britain and brought the royal purple dye to Rome. Near Tyre today is the tomb which is pointed out as that of Hiram, King of Tyre.
